- 1) If you take a text out of the context, you have a pretext – excuse.
 - 2) Pauline letters are prescriptive.

***As men and women worship in Spirit and Truth,
they will emphasize their roles over their equality!***

- Men and women equally bear God’s image and are strapped with a sin nature. Rom. 7. Both are complete in Christ, both bear guilt of sin, and both are viewed by God in a state of glory.
- Men and women have God-given roles, equally important for the unity and harmony of the body. Stepping down from the role or usurping the other’s roles is detrimental to Christ’s body – church.
- Men are not superior to women even in their role. They have a different role just as the Trinity has different roles.

- 4) How quiet is quiet? _____ Consider the word quiet in 1 Tim. 2:11. It is used in Acts 22:2 and 2 Thes. 3:12. Then compare another word for quiet in Luke 18:39 and 1 Cor. 14:34. What difference do you observe? What does that mean for the context of 1 Tim. 2:11?
